## **New Medical Facility Opens**

The Mantua Family Medicine facility celebrated its first official day of business Monday, March 24, at the former Mantua Village Elementary School building in downtown Mantua.

The new 2,500-squarefoot medical facility takes up the entire first floor of the old village school, which dates to 1929. Its operation is being overseen by Dr. Yongjin Chen, a board certified physician in family medicine and geriatrics.

Community residents had the opportunity to meet Chen and hear about University Hospitals Geauga Medical Center's newest outreach facility. Hospital public relations manager, Dan Bomeli, said that outreach to surrounding communities in Portage County is important. "We're very interested in serving patients in this area," he said.

The new medical center has diagnostic capabilities, six examination rooms and is staffed by rotating physicians and medical specialists. "We officially opened today and we're already seeing patients," Chen said. "We're looking forward to treating patients ranging in age from newborns to the elderly."

Mantua Family Medicine is located at 10803 Main St. and business hours are 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. on Mondays, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Tuesday through Friday and half-day service on Saturdays. For additional information, call the office at (330) 274-2030.

## **Crestwood Schedules Planning Meeting**

As part of its ongoing efforts to improve academic progress, financial stability, and community responsiveness, Crestwood is updating its *Continuous Improvement Plan*. This plan lays out the goals and pathways for the district in key areas. The Board and administration use the plan to establish annual goals, checking frequently to make sure goals are being met.

The forum will be held April 17 from 6-8 pm at the Crestwood Primary School and will include table discussions facilitated by principals and other district administrators. Everyone will have a chance to discuss the current status and provide input into future plans in each of the following areas:

- 1. Academic/Instructional Programming and Goals
- 2. Buildings & Grounds (including Facility Planning)

- 3. School Finances
- 4. Support Services: Transportation, Food Service, and Technology
- 5. District Communications, Public Engagement, and School Climate

## **Postage Rates Increase May 12**



The cost of a first-class stamp will rise to 42 cents starting May 12.

The price of the Forever stamp will go up at the same time, meaning those stamps can still be purchased for 41 cents but will remain good for first-class

postage after the rate increase takes effect.

The charge for other services, such as advertising mail, periodicals, packages special services will also change. Changes in the price for Priority Mail and Express Mail will be announced later.

Postage rates last went up in May, 2007, with a first-class stamp jumping 2 cents to the current 41-cent rate. Under the new law regulating the post office that took effect in late 2006, the agency is allowed to increase rates with 45-days notice as long as changes are within the rate of inflation for the previous 12 months.

Under the new law, postal prices will be adjusted annually each May, the Postal Service said. Officials said they plan to give 90 days notice of future changes, twice what is required by law. While the charge for the first ounce of a first-class letter rises to 42 cents, the price of each added ounce will remain 17 cents, so a two-ounce letter will go up a penny to 59 cents. The cost to mail a post card will also go up a penny, to 27 cents. Other increases set for May 12:

- \* Large envelope, 2 ounces, \$1, up 3 cents.
- \* Money Orders up to \$500, \$1.05, unchanged.
- \* Certified mail, \$2.70, up 5 cents.
- \* First-class international letter to Canada or Mexico, 72 cents, up 3 cents.
- \* First-class international letter to other countries, 94 cents, up 4 cents.

## **Revitalization Committee Report**

January Town Meeting Draws a Crowd; Audience Asks Insightful Questions About Revitalization Project



About 50 people, mostly Village residents, attended the January town meeting to see sketches of possible improvements for downtown's commercial district. E.G.&G., Inc project manager, Rod Garrison, spoke about the Downtown Mantua Revitalization project, and the importance of a healthy downtown to the community at large, before asking for feedback and questions from the audience. Part of his presentation, along with the Q&A that followed is below.

\* \* \* \* \*

Mantua Village has many assets that make our Village an attractive community in which to live and work.

However, the worn out, and unattractive appearance of Mantua's downtown district communicates a negative image to visitors and adversely affect the community's economic development potential and quality of life.

Economic Development "Truths":

Private investment is attracted to areas of perceived opportunity

The perception of opportunity is heavily influenced by location image

Downtown is the area of the community most often seen by visitors

Downtown must project a strong and positive location image in order to attract investment to the community

The Mantua Downtown Revitalization Project is addressing the need to improve the image of the downtown district. The design drawings describe a comprehensive program of street corridor capital improvements that will help Mantua Village re-establish a stronger and more positive downtown district image.

#### Q&A

## What are prices of bike racks, waste receptacles, benches?

Depends on style, material, construction, typical metal bench expected to last 20 years costs about \$900-\$1,100.

# What portion of costs can be covered by grants vs. local funding?

Typically 30% local, 70% grants

## Who writes grant applications?

E.G.&G.

#### How have private owners responded in other areas?

Positive response and efforts to keep up with improved look.

#### Will private owners be charged for upkeep?

Usually by choice of the local government; however, that is NOT considered an option in Mantua due to existing financial burdens of many businesses and residents.

# If utility wires are moved underground, where will the work start?

First phase area; often dictated by available grants.

#### What about annual maintenance costs?

E.G.&G. will provide a summary of anticipated costs for upkeep. Revitalized areas often see savings in the long-run because less "band-aid" maintenance is required.

# How long will each phase take and who will pay for future phases?

Each phase should take  $1\frac{1}{2}$  construction seasons and the same funding/grant sources will be approached for each phase; they expect and welcome future requests as they like to give money to successful endeavors.

#### How will traffic be re-routed during construction?

One lane will always be open and access to businesses will be maintained. The goal of the project is to improve business, so every effort will be made to minimize inconvenience for everyone.
